SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

NOTES FROM THE LAST BOARD MEETING #1069

An Action meeting of the Board of School Directors of the North Penn School District was held at the Educational Service Center on Thursday, June 15, 2017.

The meeting was called to order by Vincent Sherpinsky, Board President, at 7:30 p.m. Vincent Sherpinsky reminded those in attendance that the meeting was being videotaped by the school district for the community cable channel. Vincent Sherpinsky requested that members of the audience wishing to address the board should come to the microphone, state their name and address, sign the audience of citizens' logbook, and limit their questions and comments to permit time for all those who wished to speak to the board.

The board approved the following:

- Agreements in Lieu of Free and Appropriate Public Education for students #61517-31, #61517-32, #61517-33, #61517-34 and #61517-36; recommend approval of Settlement Agreement and Release for student #61517-35;
- A contract to App-Techs for security cameras at Gwyn-Nor Elementary School, Knapp Elementary School, Oak Park Elementary School, and York Avenue Elementary School in the amount of \$140,706.13. - An approve an increase of 2% to the salary/hourly rate schedule of non-union and confidential support staff for the 2017-18 fiscal year effective July 1, 2017;
- Donna Mengel as a nonmember Treasurer of the Board of School Directors for a one-year term effective July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, and the establishment of a Bond in the amount of \$5,000 with the premium to be paid by the school district. Compensation for duties assigned by the Director of Business Administration shall not exceed \$100.00 per month;
- Stephen Skrocki as Secretary to the Board of School Directors for a four-year term effective July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2021, in accordance with Section 404 of the School Code to be effective upon the furnishing of a bond in the amount of \$10,000 with the premium to be paid by the school district with a stipend of \$1,200 per year;
